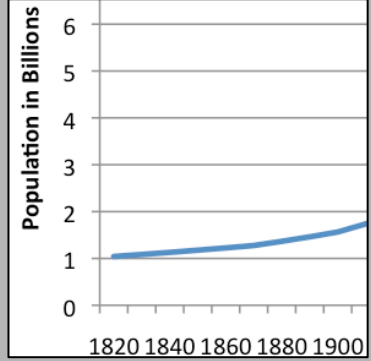


KEY CONCEPT 5.4: GLOBAL MIGRATIONS

INDUSTRIALIZATION, IMPERIALISM, & THE RISE OF THE GLOBAL CAPITALIST ECONOMY INCREASED THE AMOUNT OF MIGRATION IN THIS ERA.

CAUSES

- POPULATION GROWTH
 - Improved Food Production
 - Improved Medicine



- IMPROVED TRANSPORT
 - Trains, Autos, Steamboat

MIGRANTS

MANUAL LABORERS & SKILLED PROFESSIONALS WHO MIGRATE IN SEARCH OF WORK

- WHY RELOCATE?
 - Free will (Choice)
 - COERCED LABOR
 - Slavery
 - Indentured Servitude
 - Especially Indian & Chinese
 - Convict Labor
 - TEMPORARY
 - Seasonal (Crops)
 - Return Home after
 - Examples:
 - Japan, Lebanon, Italy

OUTCOMES

- GENDER
 - Migrants tended to be male
 - Women remained home filling in for the absent males
- ETHNIC ENCLAVES
 - Areas where migrants grouped in new areas
 - Transplant their culture to the enclave
 - Ex. "Little Italy"; "Chinatown", "Germantown"
- ANTI-IMMIGRANT POLICIES
 - Governmental prejudice against the migrants
 - Tried to regulate the #s of immigrants
 - Ex. Chinese Exclusion, White Australia
